

Sample marking grids

- The following sample marking grids provide an indication of the typical breakdown of the marks to be awarded for different skills in the Coursebook activities and revision case studies.
- If questions carry slightly different total marks from these examples, teachers may adjust the total marks for each skill accordingly.
- These mark grids are, in principle, the same as those used in the CIE Business Studies examination papers, though on some papers there may be a slight variation in the marks awarded for each skill.
- When answering these questions, students will gain experience in reading the 'prompt' word in each question and assessing which examination skills are being tested. Similarly, in applying these grids when marking student answers, teachers will need to judge whether an answer requires, in addition to knowledge and application, analysis **and** evaluation or analysis alone.

Questions requiring analysis **and** evaluation will use directive commands such as:

- evaluate
- discuss
- recommend
- justify
- assess
- to what extent.

If **no** evaluation is required, questions that require analysis will use directive commands such as:

- analyse
- explain
- consider
- examine.
